The Oasis Commuter Rail project team continues to seek public input as we move forward with the Tier 2 study of the proposed Eastern Corridor Oasis Rail line. The Oasis Commuter Rail Project Survey/Comment Form has been posted on the Eastern Corridor website to gather public thought on the development of the rail line. This is the same survey distributed at the community meetings held on April 5th, 6th, and 7th. The Oasis Commuter Rail Line is one of many long-term solutions proposed to address mobility and connectivity concerns within Greater Cincinnati's Eastern Corridor, which extends east from downtown Cincinnati to the I-275 corridor in Clermont County. Transportation routes within the Eastern Corridor already exceed their designed capacity, and traffic volumes on the interstates and most main roadways in the area are projected to increase up to 81% over current conditions by 2030.*

The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) is now taking an in-depth look at the proposed commuter rail option to determine its feasibility in terms of function, constructability and affordability. It also is evaluating possible alignment alternatives, station locations and multiple forms of rail technology.

Thank you for taking the time to provide your thoughts to the Oasis Commuter Rail project team. Your input is valuable and will be considered as part of the Tier 2 project assessment process.
